Welcome to the Town of Winamac!

Winimac – It's a story repeated in county after county across Indiana.

First, the men who governed Pulaski County met in the log home of one of the county commissioners. Then, in the 1840's, they ordered a frame courthouse constructed. That was followed in 1862 by a brick courthouse. Finally, in 1894, a limestone Romanesque-style courthouse was completed.

That's the point at which paths of this story diverge across the state. In some cases, those courthouses still stand. In others, these limestone buildings, too, have been replaced by more modern structures, mostly during the past half-century.

The courthouse in Winamac, county seat for the government of Pulaski County, is an example of the former. That Bedford limestone building with a central clock tower remains as the center of the downtown district. Its clock tower still can be seen for blocks away. While some functions have been moved to other buildings, the courts and much of the rest of county government remain there.

Not too far from the courthouse is another structure for which the town perhaps is even better known, at least locally. It is the Memorial Bridge, a foot bridge that crosses the Tippecanoe River.
