RSMU Current Projects

Currently, Rising Sun Municipal Electric Utility is working on a three-phase pole replacement project that covers three areas of the City. This also ties into another project where they are checking their systems poles for problems and getting them replaced before they become an issue. Currently RSMU serves 1,622 electric meters.

The Water/Wastewater Department has an ongoing project for relining sewer mains so that infiltration by plants and groundwater abating and exercising valves and hydrants ensure proper operation when needed.
