

## **Night Work & Low Visibility Hazards**

If you can't see it, you can't control it





- > Reduced visibility increases the risk of falls, equipment strikes, and missed hazards.
- ➤ Use high-lumen headlamps, area lights, and reflective PPE.
- ➤ Mark hazards clearly with glow tape or lights (trenches, guy wires, drop-offs).
- > Ensure truck-mounted lighting doesn't create glare or deep shadows.
- > Fatigue is amplified at night rotate roles and take breaks as needed.

Do a "hazard walk" before starting night work — walk the site and identify risks.
